On Membership

At last count, the Baltimore County Retired School Personnel Association membership stood at 1986, give or take 20 or 30. That's second in the state behind only Montgomery County. However, our membership dropped by about two and a half percent due mainly to the passing of many members during 2012 (see page four) and of course dropouts. As of March 1, 2013, BCRSPA has lost about 41 members.

As an organization, everything we do from lobbying the Maryland Legislature to arranging bi-annual membership luncheons, from creating local bus trips to recommending over seas travel, from defending our healthcare to awarding scholarships impacts membership recruitment. So, there is a need for each of us to recruit one new member; if 50% of us are successful, we will increase BCRSPA membership by 600 to 700 new members. With a membership of more than 2500 individuals, we can achieve influence on the local bargaining level (healthcare) and the state organizational (MRSPA) level.

EMERITUS MEMBERSHIP

Once a member or prospective member reaches 90 years of age, she or he is granted emeritus status and free membership in the Maryland Retired School Personnel Association (MRSPA); this status includes all membership benefits. Once Baltimore County

> members or prospective members reach 80 years of age, they are granted emeritus status for the local dues only.

Please clip the membership form and hand-deliver, ground mail, or email to a retired education friend. All BCRSPA members should know that Baltimore County has the second highest number of retired residents in the US behind only Dade County, Florida.
