- Maintain state funding for pensions—not shift pension funding to local jurisdictions.
- ☐ Keep current cost-of-living adjustment formula for existing employees and retirees.
- ☐ Return to full actuarial funding—not continuing corridor funding.
- ☐ Protect retirees' health care.

 We are fortunate to have a

 MRSPA Legislative Committee
 that reviews these bills and many
 others, writes and testifies for or
 against the bills that would affect
 retirees and encourages all of us to
 contact our local representatives to
 express our thoughts and concerns
 on these matters.

This session will soon end, and there is always the rush to pass the important bills, especially the budget. This is the time that we must be aware of our representatives' thoughts and actions, and react to them.

On a much lighter note, the April BCRSPA's annual business meeting and scholarship recognition luncheon will be held at Columbus Gardens. As a member, you need to be part of the decision making process as we approve a budget for 2012–2013, vote on constitution and bylaw changes and recognize the newly elected officers.

At the scholarship recognition luncheon, following the meeting, each high school student recipient will be introduced and honored with a \$1500 scholarship. It is also remarkable to hear about some of their amazing accomplishments.

Do you know?

Maryland's Motor Vehicle
Administration (MVA) recently
announced it has added an emergency contact option to Maryland
driver's licenses. Maryland drivers
can now add up to three emergency
contacts to their driver's license so
police will know who to call if an
accident occurs. The emergency
contact information is stored electronically on an individual's driver's license and will be available
only to authorized personnel.

You can go to MVA's Web site at www.mva.maryland.gov and add three emergency contacts in just a few minutes. You will need to have your driver license number. Go to the Web site, on the right find "Do

It Online" and there you will see the choice and click "Emergency Contacts" and in the next menu again click on "Emergency Contacts" to add your emergency contacts. The entire process takes less than 10 minutes.



If you are uncertain of the legitimacy of someone representing the Maryland State Retirement and Pension System, please contact Member Services at 410-625-5555 or 800-492-5909.

The Maryland Attorney General's Office has a booklet entitled "A Consumer Guide for Seniors" that provides helpful suggestions to help you protect your personal information. The guide can be read online at www.oag.state.md.us/seniors.htm or a free copy can be ordered by mail by calling 410-576-6500.

Another valuable source of information regarding the prevention of fraudulent and deceptive business practices is the Federal Trade Commission. Their article "How Not to Get Hooked by 'Phishing Scam" can be found at www.ftc.gov/bcp/edu/pubs/consumer/alerts/alt127.shtm.

Easy computers

For seniors and others that want a home computer that is easy to use, there are several that are specifically designed today:

- ☐ Talking touch screens. By simply touching the clearly labeled on-screen option of your choice with your finger. You can usually find one for about \$600 to \$999 depending on the size of the screen. 500 gigabytes is plenty for most.
- ☐ HP Senior PC is a brand of Hewlett Packard that comes completely set up and ready to use right out of the box. There are several models, even a laptop.
- ☐ Autopilot desktop computer offers speech-to-text capabilities that let you write letters, e-mails and documents by speaking into the computer's microphone. This model is more expensive. It will cost from \$1100 to \$1800.
- ☐ There are also some computers designed for impaired vision.

While the iPad 2 tablet computer is not designed specifically for seniors its simple iOS operating system makes it easy to understand and use.
