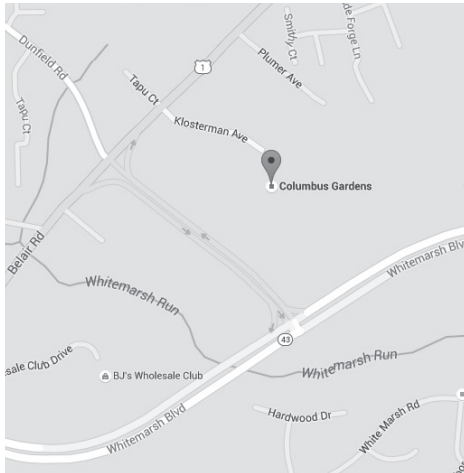

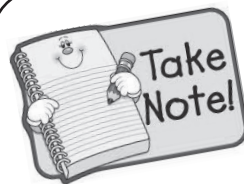

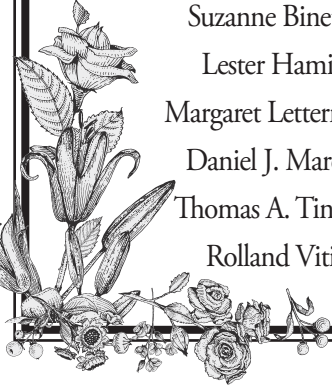

Cheap Identity Protection

Guarding your identity and credit doesn't have to be expensive. Pricy ID protection services may be useful for some, but you may be able to save money by doing the work to protect your identity yourself. Some of the ways include:

1 Credit report check- For the best protection, go to **AnnualCreditReport.com** and check your credit report for any suspicious activity. This service is free.

2 An unlisted phone number- An unlisted number will keep you off public directories used by scammers.

3 External storage - Computer-crippling ransomware can hijack your computer, so back up important files on portable USB thumb drives. Thumb drives start at \$5.00.

4 Prepaid debit card- If your debit card is used fraudulently, you could be out a lot of money. Prepaid debit cards are safer, limiting your potential losses.

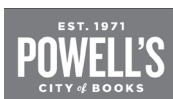

Cash in On Your Castoffs



Whether you're getting out of debt or earning some extra vacation money, selling your old stuff is the perfect way to cash in. Use the warm weather to your advantage. If you have books, check out: **Powell's @ powells.com**. It is an independent bookstore based in Portland, Oregon.

How it works:

Powell's won't buy books with stains, tears, water damage, broken spines or musty odors. But if you have hardbacks or paperbacks in good condition, the Portland, Oregon bookstore chain will take them off your hands. Use the “sell books” tab at the top of the home page and enter your used books' ISBN (*the nine-digit number near the bar code on the back*) to pull up the automatic offer. Mail in the books and Powell's will resell them on line or at one of its brick and mortar stores.

Shipping:

Powell's prepays for a shipping label you download from the site, but you will have to box up the books and mail them.

Cash In:

Users typically make 20% of a book's resale value. Powell's will send you your cash through PayPal.

Where Design Lovers Buy & Sell

How it works:

Upload a photo, description and dimensions of your item on your computer. If Chairish decides to take the item, it will edit the picture, display it on a white backdrop to make your listing look more enticing. You set a cost and if an offer meets that price, the item sells automatically.

Shipping:

For small pieces such as book ends, baskets and throw pillows, you pack and mail the items using a prepaid shipping label from Chairish. For big pieces like headboards, dressers, armoires, and tables, Chairish coordinates white-glove movers to pick them up at your place and deliver to the buyer.

Cash In:

Sellers typically make from 80% to 97% of the item's resale price.
